

## You must be careful







## Must for obligation, mustn't for prohibition

Must is a modal verb. You use must to talk about something you're obliged or strongly advised to do.

You often use it when you talk about safety instructions.

You must fasten your seat belt.

You use must not, (mustn't) to talk about something you aren't allowed to do or you're strongly advised not to do.

 You mustn't lean out of the window.

I: i(s)land, i(s)les

Ireland is an i(s) and. The British I(s) les are not part of Ireland.

T: lis(t) en, fas(t) en, of(t) en, whis(t) le, cas(t) le, Chris(t) mas
